This Week's News

Reading News: This week we are going to start learning about elements of poetry and understanding the difference between figurative and literal language. We will learn about stanzas and lines. We will also understand how and what a simile, metaphor, hyperbole, onomatopoeia, alliteration, and personification are and how they are used in poetry. We are going deeper into how this language is used in poetry this week.

Math News: In math, we are continuing multiplication and division. We are also working on multiplying by 10s; for example, $30 \times 4 = 120$. We are also looking at patterns we find in math. Think of a multiplication table and when you look at multiples of 5 what do you notice, or multiples of 3. In both they switch between an even and an odd number. There will be a math test on Friday.

Science and Social Studies News: In science we will be working on our matter unit. This will be understanding the different states of matter and how matter can change states. In social studies we will start our unit on economics. This will review needs, wants, consumer, producer. We will also go into scarcity and how units of money differ in the countries within North America.
