Jack Mezirow, a pioneer in adult learning and a former professor at Columbia University's Teachers College, said, "a defining condition of being human is that we have to understand the meaning of our experience." Reflection is what takes our learning experiences and cements them as lasting impressions. It's a practice that allows students to zoom out, assess their progress, and determine where they'd like to go as learners and people.

At the end of the school year, take time to provide authentic reflection moments to help your student think about the past year and what's to come.

- Check HAC often. This is our best advice to stay on top of grades and missing/late assignments.


