This month, the last month of school, we will conduct mock trials. The classes are divided into three separate cases. There is a prosecuting and defense attorney that will be required to give opening and closing arguments, and direct exam and cross exam witnesses. The students will play each part of the trial in-

cluding the defendant, victim, and all the witnesses. Their parts are memorized and they will have to answer questions on the stand.

The students not on that case will sit as the jury and deliver a verdict. The case outcome depends on how well the attorneys do and how believable are the witnesses. Good Luck!
