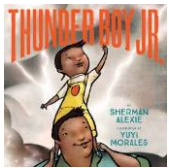


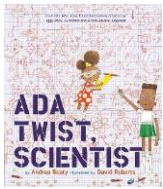
***Douglas, You Need Glasses* by Ged Adamson**

Meet Douglas, a dog with a big problem: he needs eyeglasses but doesn't know it, and his bad eyesight tends to land him in some pretty hairy situations.



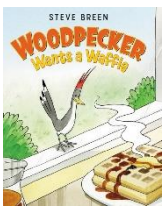
***Thunder Boy Jr.* by Sherman Alexie illustrated by Yuyi Morales**

Thunder Boy Jr. wants a normal name...one that's all his own. Dad is known as Big Thunder, but Little Thunder doesn't want to share a name.



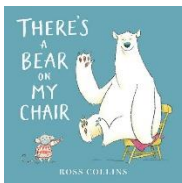
***Ada Twist, Scientist* by Andrea Beaty illustrated by David Roberts**

Ada Twist is a very curious girl who shows perseverance by asking questions and performing experiments to find things out and understand the world.



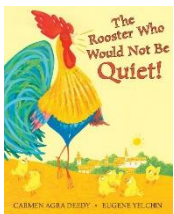
***Woodpecker Wants a Waffle* by Steve Breen**

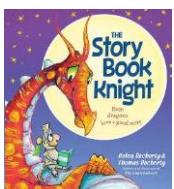
***There's a Bear on my Chair* by Ross Collins**

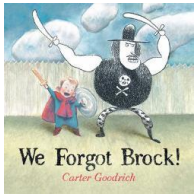
***The Rooster Who Would not be Quiet* by Carmen Deedy Illustrated by Eugene Yelchin**

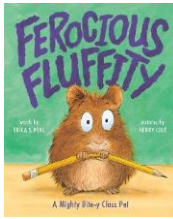
***We Forgot Brock* by Carter Goodrich**

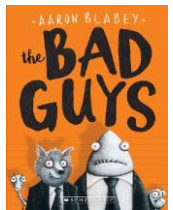
***Let Me Finish* by Minh Le Illustrated by Isabel Roxas**

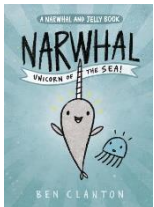
***Ferocious Fluffity* by Erica Perl Illustrated by Henry Cole**

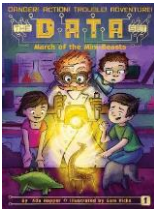
***The Bad Guys* by Aaron Blabey**

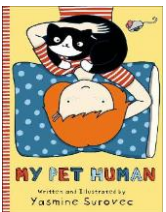
***Narwhal: Unicorn of the Sea* by Ben Clanton**

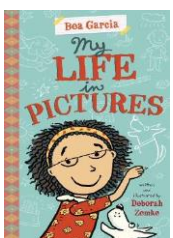
***March of the Mini Beasts* by Ada Hopper Illustrated by Sam Ricks**
