

Fiction or Non-Fiction Write a letter to your teacher telling her why you liked or didn't like the book. Must be at least 4-5 sentences.	Fiction or Non-Fiction Choose 3 words that you didn't know or you thought were interesting. Write the sentence the word was in and then write a sentence telling what the word means.
