1	1	George Washington	1789-1797	No Party	Mr. President, Whiskey Rebellion, Two-term precedent, strengthened federal gov't (via Hamilton)
2	2	John Adams	1797-1801	Federalist	VP for 2 terms under Washington, XYZ Affair, Alien and Sedition Acts, not re-elected
3	3	Thomas Jefferson	1801-1809	Democratic-Republican	VP under Adams, shrunk government and military, Louisiana Purchase, Embargo Act to avoid Napoleonic Wars

4	4	James Madison	1809-1817	Democratic-Republican	"Little Jimmy", Father of the Constitution, Jefferson's Sec. of State, War of 1812
5	5	James Monroe	1817-1825	Democratic-Republican	Helped negotiate Louisiana Purchase, Little opposition in 1816 or 1820, Era of Good Feelings, Monroe Doctrine
6	6	John Quincy Adams	1825-1829	Democratic-Republican (split begins)	Son of #2, Great Secretary of State: Oregon, Florida, Lost pop. vote but beat Jackson in House of Reps, Served/Died in HR
7	7	Andrew Jackson	1829-1837	Democrat (beat the Whigs)	"Old Hickory", populist (common man), wanted to kill Electoral College, bullied Congress, called "King Andrew" by the Whigs, fought against National Bank

8	8	Martin Van Buren	1837-1841	Democrat	"Little Magician", Sec of State and VP to Jackson, worst economic depression ever
9	9	William Henry Harrison	1841	Whig	Indiana Territory Governor, Indian fighter, Tippecanoe, War of 1812, Died of Pneumonia one month into term!
10	10	John Tyler	1841-1845	Whig - No Party	Harrison VP - " Tippecanoe and Tyler too"first to "succeed" after death of Prez, states rights, expelled from Whig Party after bank veto, first impeachment resolution
11	11	James k Polk	1845-1849	Democratic	Expansionist: added Texas, Oregon (49th parallel) and California (won war w/Mexico)

12	12	Zachary Taylor	1849-1850	Whig	"Old Rough and Ready", southerner and slave owner but a strong nationalist, Mexican War hero, died 16 months into term
13	13	Millard Fillmore	1850-1853	Whig	Taylor's VP, succeeded after Taylor's death, Compromise of 1850, deprived renomination by angry Whigs.
14	14	Franklin Pierce	1853-1857	Democratic	Supporter of Comp 1850, saw son killed, not a happy guy
15	15	James Buchanan	1857-1861	Democrat	Bachelor, Country splitting over slavery, Bloody Kansas, split of Democratic Party

16	16	Abe Lincoln	1861-	Republican	Civil War, Move towards abolitionism, Gettysburg address, assassinated by Booth
17	17	Andrew Johnson	1865-1869	Republican	Stayed in Congress even after Tenn seceded union, succeeded upon Lincoln's death, liberal reconstruction plan, "impeached" by House of Reps but acquitted by one vote in Senate
