## ADVANCED TOPICS IN MATH

**Teacher**: Elisa West

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**Course Description:** The purpose of this course is to enhance and continue the study of mathematics after Algebra I, II, and Geometry and to provide students with a college level foundation. Topics include polynomials, logarithms, conic sections, matrices, trigonometry, probability and SAT/ACT prep.

#### **Required Materials:**

Textbook

Loose-leaf notebook with sections for lessons, assignments, and quizzes

1 box of tissues

Pencils (quizzes and tests done in ink are unacceptable)

Calculator (TI84+ or equivalent; please let me know if you cannot get one)

**Evaluation:** Assignments, quizzes and examinations as determined by the teacher.

Homework will be assigned daily. Late work will receive 50% if complete. Quarter Grade: Summative Assessments 80% Formative Assessments 20%

# Attendance/Make-up Work/Extra Help:

- Attendance on a regular basis is imperative. Should an absence occur, it is the student's responsibility to promptly check the assignment list or website to find out the work missed due to an absence.
- All work missed due to an absence must be made up promptly (homework in a number of days equal to the number of days absent, to a maximum of 5 days; tests/quizzes on day of return in class or during EXCELTime as directed by me). If the deadline is not met, no credit will be given (Exception: homework can earn half-credit whether a student is absent or not if it is complete and turned in by the day of the test). Make-up tests and quizzes may differ from the original.

- If a student makes less than 70% on a test, they may take a retest evaluation which will differ from the original. In order to retest, all assignments in the unit must be completed and turned in at least 2 days before the retest deadline. Each of these assignments must have the student's name, the page number(s), and problem numbers listed at the top of the page and ALL problems worked. Retests will be done during EXCELTime (as directed by me). Maximum score on a retest is 70%.
- If a student needs extra help, he/she may come to EXCELTime.
- The SJCSD Student Code of Conduct will be followed for determining maximum
  allowable credit for work missed due to an absence. Cutting/truancy will result in
  no credit for coursework, tests and quizzes during the absence.
- If a student misses a review day for an announced test or quiz, the student is expected to review and be prepared to take the test/quiz on the scheduled day.

#### **Classroom Behavior:**

All school rules are enforced in the classroom. In particular, NO FOOD, DRINKS, AND ELECTRONIC DEVICES are allowed (exception: calculator being used to do assigned work).

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## GOING ON A FIELD TRIP OR HAVE A PRE-EXCUSED ABSENCE?

Enjoy your trip! Please remember that to be out of class excused, you need to keep up with the regularly scheduled class. Your responsibilities include the following:

- 1. Homework from the previous class should be given to a fellow student or me for checking while you are away from school. Failure to do this before you leave may result in a zero for that day's work.
- 2. While you are on your trip, we will be working in class. You must get the work from a fellow student, the website, or from me (**before**) you leave on your trip. The assignments given while you are gone are to be completed as if you were in class. In other words, when you return to school on the day following the trip, you will be current with the class. - 3. If you will be missing a scheduled quiz or test on the day out of class, arrangements for make-up must be made **before** your absence.
